## PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Good morning, everyone. We're ready to get started for the August meeting of the Missouri Gaming Commission.

And before we get started, I'd like to take just a moment, probably a lot of you here in the crowd know what my day job is as the Director of the Surviving Spouse and Family Endowment in Kansas City which provides a benefit to the families of first responders killed in the line of duty, and I just want to take a moment this morning to recognize that in Kansas City in the last 30 days we've lost two first responders both killed in the line of duty on the 26th of July and again yesterday on the 26th of August. So please keep these families in your prayers, and thank you for indulging me in recognizing that we've lost a couple of first responders in our area. Thank you so much.

I'll now call the August 27, 2025 Missouri Gaming
Commission meeting to order. Angle, would you call the roll?

MS. FRANKS: Chairman Zimmerman?

CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: We have a quorum. Let's get started. We'll start this morning with Team Member Recognition, and I believe Cheryl Alonzo, Assistant Director of Compliance, and John Hall will be making some presentations this morning. I'll let you all decide who goes first.

MR. HALL: Good morning, Commissioners. Are we rolling? Can you hear me? All right, we arm wrestled and I lost, so that meant I had to go first.

But first off we have Patti Smith. You're going to have to go ahead and come on up here. She's already questioning things.

Patti has been here for 25 years, which that is most of the existence of the Gaming Commission. I think we're at 31 years as a whole now. Patti works in Administration and handles our accounts payable and is also our like de facto building manager. She's always making sure that our facilities and our supplies are always in order.

If you know Patti, she loves being the center of attention. And if you really know Patti, you know that everything I just said was a lie because this is super uncomfortable for her; but she is very social. She's a friend to many, but group settings like this, not really her thing.

I've only known Patti for a couple of years, but I do know that if you want something done and you want it done now,

that's the person you want. If you need somebody tracked down or if a vendor has a billing messed up, she will stay on them until it is correct. And I'm just super thankful for that because then I don't have to do it.

Patti always prides herself on doing things right the first time, which makes my job way easier. And Patti also does so many things behind the scenes, whether it's in this building or for the organization as a whole; but she doesn't really want to be recognized, she just does them because it's the right thing to do and because she cares.

With her 25 years of being at the Gaming Commission, she's kind of what I would call a know-er of things, so whenever I came on board, there was a lot of, Why do we do this? And I could always count on Patti to be like, Well, because X, Y, Z happened, and that's the way it is, so I'm super thankful for that.

And on behalf of the Gaming Commission, Missouri Gaming Commission, I'd like to thank and recognize Patti for her 25 years of service. And I have a certificate for you.

Next we have Brandy Klouzek. It's so uncomfortable standing up here in front of everybody.

Brandy has been with us for 15 years. Brandy also works in administration and is our one-man band for all things HR. For several years now, Brandy has been the only HR person for the Gaming Commission. She's literally our A-to-Z for all

things Human Resources; interviews, onboarding, employee relations, payroll, and so many other things.

I'm lucky to have her as part of my staff, and I've learned a ton from her. I really can't say enough about Brandy's professionalism. In HR, you have to deal with a lot of sensitive issues, and Brandy just has the ability to look at all sides of an issue and present solutions in a logical way.

Our staff always feels comfortable talking to Brandy, and they trust that they'll be treated with confidentiality, dignity, and respect. She handles all that touchy-feely stuff, which is great because then I don't have to because that's definitely not my thing. I'm pretty black and white, and she can handle all that gray area stuff.

For people who are applying for jobs at the Gaming Commission, she's really the first person that they have any interaction with; and I really can't think of a better person to be the face of the Gaming Commission in that way.

So with that, on behalf of the Missouri Gaming

Commission, I'd like to thank you and recognize you for your

15 years of service.

MS. ALONZO: Okay. Next we'd like to have Leshia
Kempker come up here, as we are celebrating Leshia's 25 years
of service with the Gaming Commission. Many of you know
Leshia is our Compliance Audit Manager, but few of you would

know that Leshia first started in the Bingo section as a Bingo Auditor and then she moved over to Tax section, served there as a Tax Auditor, and then she was -- she joined my team when I was the Compliance Audit Manager.

She joined my team as a Compliance Auditor II, and at that time I was absolutely drowning in work. It was terrible how much work I had, and Leshia came and she was my life preserver. She like jumped in and just helped me from day one, and she hasn't stopped helping me yet. She is always there, willing to help out with any projects.

So she's been the Compliance Audit Manager for 13 years, and so I thought as a gift to her it would be fun to kind of share what other co-workers had to say about her and what team members had to say about her.

When I thought about -- you know, when I said, What do you think about Leshia, here's what they had to say. Leshia is incredibly intelligent and the source of knowledge that many of us turn to with questions about any facet of the MGC. She is willing to help with whatever is needed from her auditors and does a great job guiding her teams. She was instrumental in the creation of new sports wagering rules, she took homework and always went the extra mile.

And another said, Leshia is a person of highest integrity, always putting 100 percent in to make sure she's providing the best answers to any questions and holding

everyone to a high standard. Her dedication to the MGC and focus on consistency ensures audits and any other projects she's involved in are truthful, fair, and of high quality.

Then the third one said, Leshia is always helpful, no matter if it's just to listen, offer advice, or help another department with a project or work flow. She's especially helpful when a decision needs to be made or directions need to be given.

So obviously, she's very well respected. Leshia is a work horse. I mean she knocks stuff down. This place would not be the same without her. So congratulations, Leshia, on 25 years with the MGC. And if it's not too much to ask, can you just stay 25 more? That would be wonderful. Plus, she gets a day of vacation, woot-woot, with this.

23	MR. VENNEMAN: Thank you. Good morning, Chairman and
24	Commi ssi oners.
25	Under Tab J we have a Preliminary Order of Discipline

1	directed at Ameristar Casino St. Charles. The proposed
2	discipline arises from an investigation that revealed the
3	casino's surveillance department lost the required camera
4	coverage and video retention in sensitive areas involving
5	multiple time frames and multiple cameras on December 21 of
6	2024.
7	The Disciplinary Review Board recommended \$5,000 in
8	this matter. In response to the proposed discipline,
9	Ameristar Casino St. Charles communicated that they take full
10	accountability for the proper functionality of their
11	surveillance system and understand the importance of ensuring
12	they retain appropriate surveillance coverage.
13	They also report that they will continue to replace
14	analog cameras covering areas over the casino gaming
15	operations in upcoming projects.
16	I'd be happy to answer any questions you have at this
17	time.
18	CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Tom, so the solution then or that
19	they see going forward, that the solution then is the
20	continued replacement of those outdated cameras?
21	MR. VENNEMAN: So in a response to this discipline,
22	they did say they've got quite a significant investment in the
23	upcoming future in several different projects in replacing
24	these analog cameras. They did ask the company of Avigilon to
25	look into the problems that they were having. I'm not sure

1	that we got an answer as to what the underlying problem was,
2	but we have not had any further issues since that time that
3	I'm aware of.
4	CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Okay. I'll be interested to hear
5	from Ameristar going forward if the company, you know, the
6	security company, you know, has provided any additional
7	MR. VENNEMAN: And I can tell you that during that time
8	frame, they were upgrading some of their systems and they were
9	rebooting every three months, and this particular situation
10	happened the day after one those reboots.

MS. EVANS: Good morning, Chairman and Commissioners.

Under Tab L is a Preliminary Order of Disciplinary Action

directed at St. Louis Gaming Ventures, LLC doing business as

Hollywood Casino St. Louis.

The proposed discipline arises from the failure of the casino to properly obtain a bounty winner's name and/or signature during bounty poker tournaments on multiple gaming days in violation of 11 CSR 45.5-180(3)(F). Specifically for the gaming days of July 18, August 4, August 29, October 20, November 21, and December 26, 2024, supporting documents for the bounty tournaments held on those dates were missing bounty winners' names, signatures, or both. Further, four of the last five tax audit reports have audit findings in which the casino failed to obtain a bounty name and/or signature for the tournaments.

The Disciplinary Review Board recommended a \$5,000 fine in this matter. In response, the casino acknowledged the errors and did not contest the fine. The casino further stated that it would undertake additional training measures and modifications to payout procedures to reduce the risk of future discrepancies.

Steven Lutjen again met with the casino's Security Manager to discuss the concerns of underage patrons being able to access the gaming floor. Master Sergeant Lutjen and the casino's Security Manager discussed additional training measures at that time.

The Disciplinary Review Board has recommended a \$5,000 fine in this matter. In response, the casino acknowledged the errors and did not contest the fine. The casino further stated that it was implementing additional training measures to include updated turnstile training, increased management oversight of security operations, increased turnstile staffing during busy hours, and progressive discipline for employees.

And I'd be happy to answer any questions that you may have.

CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Not a question, but just for the record, I know that I asked this question previously about their response to the relevant underage incident, that that be included amongst, you know, these incidents and included in the fine of \$5,000. And I just wanted to make sure for the record the Staff was aware of that and, you know, made sure that the Commission understood that that was being included in that \$5,000 fine.

CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: Yeah, thank you so much for clarifying that. Any questions for Ms. Evans? All right,
