Under Tab K, we have a Preliminary Order of Discipline directed at Bally's Kansas City Casino. The proposed discipline arises from an investigation which began after a minor was discovered on the gaming floor of the casino in violation of the Commission's Minimum Internal Control Standards, or the MICS.

On August 12 of 2024, Corporal E. A. Brinegar initiated a regulatory investigation after encountering a 17-year-old juvenile on the gaming floor. The Surveillance Department conducted an inquiry through Veridocs which revealed that the ID used by the juvenile had been scanned 32 times between July 13 of 2024 and August 12 of 2024.

Between July 31 of 2024 and August 12 of 2024, the surveillance recorded the juvenile wagering after gaining access to the casino floor on 12 different occasions. During the 32 instances he accessed the casino floor, the juvenile encountered 19 security officers and 48 employees before he was discovered and MGC was notified.

The Disciplinary Review Board recommended a \$10,000 fine in this matter. In response to the proposed discipline, Bally's Kansas City Casino has taken steps to address gaps or risks, which include Surveillance and Security audits, updating Veridocs software, and additional identification training that was extended to departments outside of Security,

1	that there are certain casinos, not necessarily in this state,
2	that mandate a photo identification to enter.

MR. VENNEMAN: Thank you. Under Tab L, we have a Preliminary Order of Discipline directed at The United States Playing Card Company. The proposed discipline arises from an investigation which began after multiple defects were discovered on playing cards in violation of 11 CSR 45-5.183.

From June 2024 through September 2024, there were five gaming reports generated which documented several manufacturing defects on the table games playing cards that were shipped to various Class B licensees by The United States Playing Card Company.

The Disciplinary Review Board recommended a \$15,000 fine in these matters. In response to the proposed discipline, The United States Playing Card Company outlined that they continue to invest in their work force and technology to strengthen and improve their processes to limit defects.

I'd be happy to answer any questions at this time.

CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: And did they indicate, Tom, like what they're doing to try and -- I mean I know they're just producing thousands and thousands and thousands of cards but, you know, those defects, and some of those are making them to the gaming floor, so --

MR. VENNEMAN: Yes. So in these five separate occasions, some of them were caught prior to being put in play, but one in particular manufacturing defect was noticed

by a player at a table game; so they had been put in play and it was noticeable enough that one of the players caught it and pointed it out to the dealer which led to this investigation.

I would additionally add we don't know the extent of any manufacturing defects. We can only look at what we've discovered. Some may have gone -- some could possibly go undiscovered, but we also only know of manufacturing defects within the State of Missouri.

So this company sends cards out all over the country, so we don't know the particular -- the scope of any manufacturing defects except for what we're dealing with. And we took that into account when looking at all these.

Now, this particular recommendation comes from the fact that there were several defects caught within a very short period of time, and we wanted to make sure that the company is paying close attention if anything is getting out of hand.

CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: So is there a certain like percentage of audit, I mean recognizing that there are hundreds of thousands of cards but, you know, those audits taking place periodically?

MR. VENNEMAN: I'm not aware of a percent, any percentage of audits; but every time a card goes into play, the casinos are supposed to be inspecting those decks to look for any of these defects.

CHAIRMAN ZIMMERMAN: All right, thank you. Any other

8	supposed to inspect the cards before they go into play and
9	then Security does an inspection following removal from play
10	on a certain percentage.

12	asking, there was no indication that the responsibility for
13	the defect was with the card manufacturer and no one else down
14	the line?
15	MS. BERHORST: Yeah, the company's response did
16	indicate that it was their responsibility and it should have
17	been caught during their quality control process.

17	5. 225, 5. 230, 5. 235, 5. 270 and 5. 300; also 11 CSR 45-9. 102.
18	9. 105, 9. 108, 9. 109, 9. 118 and 9. 121.
19	The amendments outlining the changes were provided in
20	your meeting materials. Normally the changes to each rule are
21	discussed individually; however, since there are 20 rules
22	being proposed at this time, in lieu of detailing the changes
23	made to each of the proposed amendments individually, a
24	summary of the changes is being provided.

The amendments are all related to revisions made to

Chapter E, Electronic Gaming Devices of the Minimum Internal Control Standards, or the MICS. The revisions to MICS Chapter E were made to update the chapter for electronic gaming devices and other related equipment to account for new products and to incorporate feedback from industry and Staff, variances issued by the Commission, and technological changes.

The changes made to MICS Chapter E require revisions to be made to other associated CSRs and chapters of the MICS to incorporate changes for consistency and to move standards to appropriate regulations.

For example, there were standards included in the MICS that were determined to more appropriately belong in the CSR because they were a requirement of a supplier licensee as opposed to a Class B licensee. Additionally, MICS standards were also identified as more appropriately belonging in a different chapter of the MICS and were moved accordingly for consolidation and consistency.

Generally the revisions include updating standards in terminology, clarifying requirements, modifying processes, and removing unnecessary, outdated, and duplicative language.

These amendments were proposed and approved at the December 4, 2024 Commission meeting, the public comment period ended February 14, 2025, and a public hearing was held on February 18, 2025. No public comments were received regarding the proposed amendments.

1	The approval from the Governor's office to proceed with
